Insect repellent

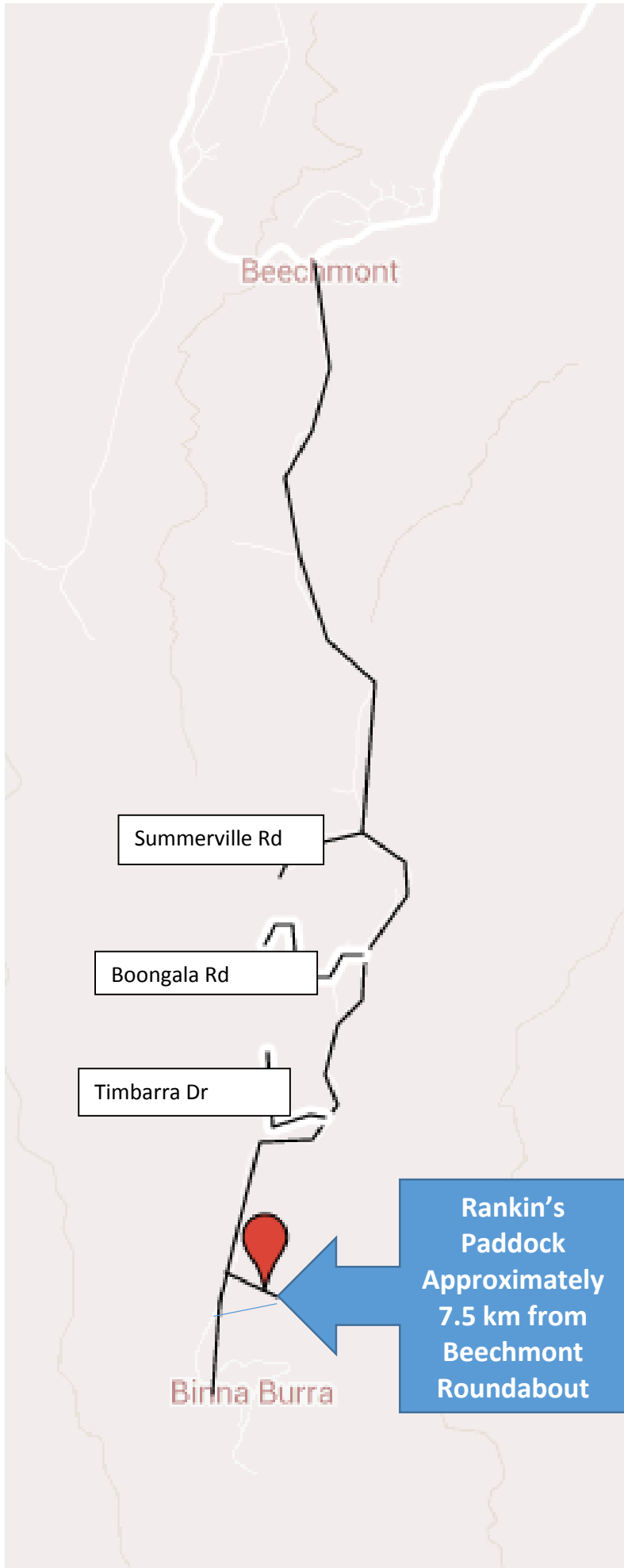
10:30: Morning tea will be provided (Damper, fresh fruit and hot water)
